### -VOTER ELIGIBILITY-

#### WHO IS ELIGIBLE TO VOTE IN WISCONSIN?


- You must be at least 18 years of age
- You must be a U.S. Otizen
- You must reside at your current address for at least 10 days\*

\* If you have lived at your current address less than 10 days, you may be eligible to vote from the address you last lived in Wisconsin for 10 days

### -VOTER ELIGIBILITY-

#### WHO CANNOT VOTE IN WISCONSIN?

- You cannot vote if you are serving any part of a felony sentence.
- You cannot vote if you have been adjudged incompetent
- You cannot vote if you placed a bet or a wager on the outcome of the election
- You cannot vote if you have already voted in that election



#### **IMPORTANT NOTES**

- There is no such thing as a separate "Voter ID" card
- Some Absentee voters are exempt

\* These accepted IDs should be unexpired or if expired, after the date of the most recent general election: Currently November 8, 2016.

- U.S. Passport (Book or Card)\*



- State of Wisconsin Driver License or ID card Receipt
- Certificate of Naturalization
- Tribal ID Card
- Veteran's Affairs ID



#### COLLEGE, UNIVERSITY OR TECH COLLEGE STUDENT IDS +

- Student's name
- Student's signature
- Student's photo
- Date the card is issued
- Date the card expires\*



#### Additional Proof of Enrollment is Required

\*Date must be not more than 2 years from date of issuance.

#### REQUIRED ON PHOTO ID:

- Bector's Photograph
- Bector's Name
- Valid Expiration Date

### A CURRENT ADDRESS IS NOT REQUIRED

### -ACCEPTABLE ID WTHOUT PHOTO-

#### IDS WITHOUT A PHOTO THAT CAN BE USED:

- Otation dated within 60 days of the election
- Notice of Intent to Revoke or Suspend a Driver License dated within 60 days of the election
- State of Wisconsin ID card WITHOUT Photo issued for religious objection to being photographed

#### -ACCEPTABLE PHOTOID-HOW TO GET A FREE ID If you do not have a certificate or other door

- An elector does not need a birth certificate to vote. However, if you have documents like a certified birth certificate, social security card and proof of residence, bring them to the DMV when applying for your free Wisconsin ID Card
- If you do not have a certified birth certificate or other documents available, the DMV has a petition process to verify records for free. You can still get a State of Wisconsin ID card receipt after one visit to the DMV even if your documents listed above are unavailable


#### **CERTIFICATE OF** NATURALIZATIO





- WHO NEEDS TO REGISTER?
- First time voters
- If you moved
- If you changed your name

#### HOW TO REGISTER:

- By Mail- Postmark by 3<sup>rd</sup> Wednesday before Election Day
- Register Online until 3<sup>rd</sup> Wednesday before Election Day
- Municipal Olerk's Office through the Friday before Election
- At the Polling Place on Election Day
- CAN NO LONGER REGISTER TO VOTE WITH A SPECIAL REGISTRATION DEPUTY WHO VERIFIES POR

#### PHOTO ID VERSUS PROOF OF RESIDENCE:

- Proof of Residence documents prove your address
- Proof of Identification documents prove who you are

### -REGISTRATION & PROOF OF RESIDENCE-WHAT CAN BE USED AS PROOF OF RESIDENCE?

- A valid, unexpired, Wisconsin Driver License or Wisconsin State ID Card
- A document issued by a unit of government
- A utility bill, good for 90 days
- A bank statement

This is not a complete list, there are many documents that may qualify as Proof of Residence. Contact WEC or your clerk if you are unsure.

#### ABOUT PROOF OF RESIDENCE:

- Your proof of residence must include your current name and current address
- You may show your proof of residence electronically on your phone or your computer





#### VOTING WOULD LOOK GOOD ON YOU.

need to vote in the next election. If you don't, get a Wisconsin state ID card for free at your nearby Division of Motor Vehicles. You just need a few papers, like a certified birth certificate, Social Security card and a utility bill. There are several different documents you can use. So get your free ID today and remember to bring it when you vote.

#### ARE THERE ACCOMMODATIONS AVAILABLE?

- Accessible voting equipment
- Ourbside voting
- Exemption from signing poll book if unable to sign due to disability
- You may have someone assist you with the voting process



#### **MSIT "MYVOTEWI.GOV"**

- Select "What's On My Ballot"
- Enter Home Address
- Ballots are typically available 47 days before an election with federal contests and 21 days before state and local contests.
